Siblings in Christ,

Well, we have finally come near to that time. It is about a month until I leave for one year of active duty. It has been a long journey of work to get to this point and yet there is still so much I have to do in preparation. The last couple of weeks will likely be a flurry of tasks for me because, it's the Navy I'm dealing with; "hurry up and wait" is standard practice. Regardless, my departure is soon and a new chapter for us all waits to be written.

I don't have wise words to share right now. Stress, grief, anxiety, anticipation, excitement, joy, sorrow are all words to describe what I'm feeling, and what I'm sure many of you all are feeling. Missing my family and the many events and activities with them is where my biggest grief and sorrow emanates. But I will miss this place also while I'm gone. I will miss the people. I won't miss the crazy schedule too much; having just one full-time job for a year will be nice. I am also excited about the challenge ahead of me. I have no idea what full-time military chaplaincy will be like. It may be great or it may be miserable. I already know that the grass isn't greener on the other side, it's just a different shade, Marine Corps green. I'm also excited about seeing how you and we grow in this time apart. #### From Rev. Nick Johannes

I was born on D-Day of 1944 in Manitowoc County, the oldest of five siblings. The shadows of World War II were much a part of my childhood, with a German Prison of War Camp just a few miles from my home. I believe my parents sheltered us from the emotional proximity of war through our strong religious heritage. As a result, I began my high school studies at a Catholic Seminary. Following twelve years of study and completion of both a Bachelor of Arts and Master of Divinity degrees, I was ordained a priest in Seymour, WI where my family lived at the time.

During my years as a Priest, I served in six parishes in the Green Bay diocese. In those, I was provided most of the necessities of life without the worries or responsibilities that a marriage and family might bring. However, as time went on, there was one want and need I could not ignore and that was to be married. Even with the adventures of such pursuits of being a chaplain for the DePere Fire Department or serving as a chaplain in the Army National Guard 32<sup>nd</sup> infantry, there was something missing in my life.

I married Judy in 1995 and shortly thereafter began seminary at Wartburg in Dubuque. In 1998, upon completion of studies and internship at Wartburg, I was Called and Installed as Associate Pastor at Emmanuel (ELCA) Lutheran Church in Seymour, only blocks from the Catholic Church in which I had been ordained 28 years prior. In 2004, I was called to serve as Senior Pastor at both Porterfield Lutheran and Beaver American Lutheran Churches. Since my retirement in 2010, I have provided pulpit supply at the ELCA churches in the Menominee Valley Conference, in Oconto, and two area Presbyterian and UCC churches.

This is now my 55<sup>th</sup> year of ministry of God's Word and Sacrament and I am looking forward to serving with Pastor Lee Goodwin in the congregations of Good Shepherd and Our Savior's. I ask for the Holy Spirit to uplift and support each of us in this time of transition. God for us, we call you Father; God alongside us, we call you Jesus; God within us, we call you Holy Spirit. Amen

We will, as the Spirit leads us, strive to serve our Savior who is the Good Shepherd.

Food preparation will take place on Saturday, October 25<sup>th</sup>. We will need help chopping


vegetables and prepping for the meal. This will start at **9:00 am.** Watch for a sign-up sheet for these jobs. Many hands make for light and fast work.
